## CARAVANNING AND CAMPING

With so much to offer those that enjoy camping and caravanning, Dungog Region has a wide range of experiences, from free bush camps to caravan parks with facilities and sites for tents or caravans.

With breath-taking National Parks and State Forests, including the World Heritage listed Barrington Tops, the Dungog Region is a camping wonderland with its pristine rivers and forests.

The Dungog Region features some of the best caravanning and camping locations in NSW, many situated in idyllic and picturesque locations with privately operated sites as well as those operated by Forestry Corporation of NSW and Reserve Trusts.

#### **DUNGOG SHOW GROUND**

Located within the township of Dungog approximately I hour north of Newcastle and 2.5 hours from Sydney.

The Showground provides powered and unpowered sites and amenities, including toilets and shower. Camping is only available at the showground when events are held

### **EAST GRESFORD SHOWGROUND**

Located 1 hour north of Newcastle and 2.5 hours north of Sydney.

Situated beside the Allyn River there are plenty of grassy locations with powered and unpowered sites available.

#### WILLIAMS RIVER HOLIDAY PARK

Located in Clarence Town on the Williams River just 45 min from Newcastle and 2.5 hours north of Sydney.

Powered and non-powered campsites, laundry, barbecue area and adjoining reserve where the children can play.



## **STATE FORESTS**

#### FRYING PAN CREEK

Located 40 min from Dungog on Frying Pan Road.

A popular camping and picnic area on the banks of the Telegherry River.

Sites for both camping and caravans.

#### COACHWOOD

Located opposite Frying Pan Creek camping area on the opposite bank of the Telegherry River.

A popular camping and picnic location for families.


