## BOOMERANG BAGS DUNGOG & SINGLE USE PLASTIC FREE DUNGOG – ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY

This group of passionate volunteers have achieved some very impressive goals in the last 2 years and deserve recognition for the goals they have achieved in steering our Shire toward a greater consciousness of our environment.

In the last 12 months, Boomerang Bags Dungog has reached 5,500 bags made as well as making over 500 fruit & veg/produce bags and cutlery tote bags. All are available (including Dungog BeeRapts) at The Dungog Growers Stall on Saturdays and at a range of supportive like-minded businesses in our community and Shire. In 2020 they also started a *Repair and Re-wear* service at our bees every 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month.

When Covid-19 arrived in March 2020, Boomerang Bags Dungog moved its focus for the next many months to making over 700 reusable fabric masks mainly for our essential services and frontline workers as well as making them free and available at our chemist for the sick and elderly.

In our Shire the following accomplishments are due to their ongoing work and messaging.

- 45 tonnes of soft plastics have been collected and diverted from landfill since 2017.
- 225kg of Dungog Cup Rescue cups & lids have been collected since SUPFD Launch in July 2019.
- 25 business have achieved Blue Planet Status
- 9 water refill stations have been installed across Shire.
- Dungog's Return and Earn Kiosk installed May 2020 stats to March 2021; 1,752,000 containers. Boomerang Bags Dungog and Single Use Plastic Free Dungog were instrumental in Dungog being given a Return & Earn Kiosk through our advocacy and work in the community to raise awareness through education as well as providing solutions.

- published two local history books: Steamships on the Paterson River by Wayne Patfield and Portraits of Paterson by Alison Pitkin

- expanded the online image collection through Flickr to have over 2000 images freely available to the public
- prepared a detailed submission objecting to the transport of material from Martins Creek Quarry through Paterson

- continued to operate despite Covid

#### TEMPEST BICYLES – OUTSTANDING NEW BUSINESS

Rob and his team at Tempest Bicyles is another stand out among the many new businesses who have commenced in the Shire in the last 2 years. It took a lot of courage to open a brand-new business to Dungog but with Rob's obvious knowledge of this industry has made it thrive. Congratulations and here is their story.

In the past 12 months we've had huge growth, as you probably know we started small on the Common with our mobile workshop but quickly outgrew what we could offer which led to our shop in Dowling Street store.

The shop has grown into a large business which has a huge range of bicycles and parts and were able to better serve the people in town and visitors in town with high quality product and quick 'turn around' service.

More recently we expanded, and we've brought my machine shop into the rear of our building where we now manufacture our own bicycles from scratch. We're about to land a couple of contracts to mass produce bicycles for other companies well as the two we already own. Currently we already manufacture bicycles that are shipped worldwide and within Australia to some acclaim with several magazine articles to back up what we do.

We're hoping this means jobs in Dungog and we'll be up skilling locals on how to construct bicycles and pay a decent wage and long-term employment.

This year has also seen the introduction of our frame building school where we take students from around Australia (and worldwide) and teach them how to build a bike frame in two weeks.

The great thing about this is, we're currently the only frame building school in Australia and we hope that the influx of students will bring grade to local businesses, Cafes and accommodation providers for the two week stay.

Recently we finished a custom- built trike which we built for a local para-athlete Stuart Jones. It's the only one of its kind and we've really pushed the technology forward for a pretty special bike.

It'll be at the para-olympics in Tokyo next month and we've even made sure that handmade in Dungog is visible on the frame to try and put our little town on the map.

It's slated for several magazine and newspaper articles which will promote the town as a whole.

This year we've all been running free mechanics workshop for kids on work experience, and we also hope to introduce these weekly for local folk too.

It's also seen the introduction of the ride Dungog bike library where we have bikes specifically for town folk or kids that aren't fortunate enough to have their own bicycle. We provided these at cost for Ride Dungog and we service them and keep them running free of charge to promote the sport.

Lastly, we've expanded, we're about to open our second shop in Newcastle in September with a third hit on its heels. We'll be bringing folk from the coast/Newcastle area on gravel/MTB tours and will be working closely with other businesses in town to continue to bring more trade. I really do believe we're all in this together.

#### THE MAGPIE – RETAIL AND PERSONAL SERVICES

The Magpie owned and run by Liz Northam in Dowling Street has great eclectic range and a great draw card for visitors and locals alike. During the 2020 lockdown Liz took this time to take a fresh look at her business and focused on sourcing a wider range of stock and visual aspect of the shop space. Liz found taking time to do some training in social media for promotion of her business was a positive move also.

Helping visitors to the area comes as second nature to her, with a range of local maps and brochures to hand out.

'We live in such a beautiful area it is not a hard sell to promote so encouraging customers to visit other retailers and eating places is important to ensure the money is spread around.'

The Magpie is a welcoming space with a warm friendly owner, opened all weekend for enhancing the visitor experience to Dungog main street. Congratulations, a worthy winner in the retail section and by comments in your nominations much appreciated by your customers.
